1. Call to Order. Notice that meeting has been filed and posted in accordance with Open Meetings Act
2. Announcement of Quorum

Kimberley Bishop called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m. with a quorum of 5 members present

3. Recognition of Invited Guests

Mr. Chris Barlow, Director of University Health Services, Oklahoma State University and Mr. Daniel Archer, Assistant Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, and Tyrance Billingsley, President, Oklahoma Student Government Association

4. Minutes of Previous Meetings –September 24, 2017 Minutes were approved

5. Student Access to Health Services and Health Insurance – Mr. Chris Barlow, Director of University Health Services, Oklahoma State University

Mr. Chris Barlow explained how the University Health Services Clinic on the Oklahoma State University, Stillwater campus is run and all the services that they offer, including: Medical imaging, a pharmacy, a women’s clinic, immunizations, an allergy clinic, health education, et cetera. He highlighted many of the benefits students receive by having an on-campus health clinic available, which includes but is not limited to overall convenience, low cost of service, flexible payment options, collaboration of resources with the counseling, disability, residence life, , interventions and threat assessment. They also offer targeted interactions, such as, concussion protocol for the intramural sports programs, the PETE program that allows fifteen to twenty premedical students to shadow different members of the clinic each semester, disability services, and free flu shots. There is a \$20 fee for service. The Oklahoma State University offers a low cost insurance for students that do not have any coverage and has a referral process to direct students to other low cost options if they choose to opt out.

6. Academic Advisement - Mr. Daniel Archer, Assistant Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education

Mr. Archer informed the Student Advisory Board that there are 25 public institutions in the state of Oklahoma and each institution is responsible for deciding how their advising is administered. He explained the three basic advising models, as well as, the benefits and disadvantages for all of them. Many universities utilize the National Academic Advising Association for their advisor training but ultimately advisor training is up to the institution. It was noted that faculty advisement performance is not always considered in evaluation.

7. Concurrent Enrollment - Mr. Daniel Archer, Assistant Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education

Mr. Archer also talked about the concurrent enrollment policy changes that took effect in the fall semester of 2017. The admission requirements for juniors were lowered to meet those of the seniors and allows schools to look at students Pre-ACT subject score, SAT subject score, PSAT10 subject score, or allows the students to satisfy an entry level assessment and course placement test verses only looking at their National ACT subject score. These revisions increased access to students, expanded the opportunities to utilize qualified high school faculty to teach concurrent enrollment and incorporated National Alliance for Concurrent Enrollment Partnerships standards to ensure that there is structure, support, and oversight when higher education institutions offer concurrent enrollment at an off-campus sites. Most concurrent enrollment is done through community colleges. The level of state funding is a concern. Mr. Archer also spoke briefly on Prior Learning Assessment and the different ways students can gain college credit outside the classroom.

8. Update on Oklahoma Student Government Association/Council of Student Presidents Fall Congress – Mr. Tyrance Billingsley, President, Oklahoma Student Government Association

Mr. Billingsley spoke of the plans for the OSGA Spring Congress taking place at Langston University. The Board has narrowed down possible dates between February 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> or February 23<sup>rd</sup> or 24<sup>th</sup>. As a board, they discussed creating a Google Drive with all the necessary documents needed for future board members so the transition runs more smoothly. They have prospective members lined up for the open positions of North Regional Director, Secretary and Treasurer. The OSGA has had a difficult transition, and hopes to institutionalize a better transition process for future boards.
