Class times offered – Daytime, evening, and weekend special programs

Special programs – Selected courses can be taken via OneNet or over the Internet, as well as weekends. Specialized training programs to enter the workforce are available in agriculture, child development and nursing.

Academic calendar – Fall semester (August through early December), spring semester (January to early May). Also offered are eight-week and 16-week classes in the spring and fall and four-week and eight-week summer programs. Mini-esters between semesters are offered.

## ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

ACT/SAT requirements – Admission is open to anyone whose high school class has graduated.

High school graduation – GED is accepted as long as student's high school class has graduated.

High school GPA – No requirements

### High school curriculum requirements

English, 4 units; Lab Science, 2 units; Math, 3 units; History and Citizenship Skills, 3 units; Other, 3 units

Application process – The following documents are required for admission to CSC – completed CSC Application for Admission; official copies of all high school and college transcripts (if applicable); ACT/SAT scores required for all students under 21 years of age.

Application deadlines – Application for admission can be made at any time, but it is advisable to apply well in advance of the first semester in which enrollment is desired.

### Transfer Students

Minimum college GPA required – None. Students academically suspended from another college are admitted in academic probation.

Maximum credits transferable – At least 15 of the final 30 hours applied toward the degree or at least 50 percent of the hours required by the institution in the major field must be satisfactorily completed at the awarding institution.

Items required for application – Transcript(s) from all colleges attended, official high school transcript, verification of proficiency in English, mathematics, reading and science, immunization documentation.

### International Students

TOEFL test requirements – Standardized testing: 500 or higher on the paper-based Test of English as a Foreign Language exam (TOEFL) or 173 or higher for the computer-based test. Intensive English Program: 460 or higher on the paper-based TOEFL or 140 on the computer-based test.

*Connors State College is a community college with its main campus located in the heart of Green Country in Warner (along the I-40 corridor). Beginning in 1908 as an agricultural school, CSC celebrated its 100th year of educational service in 2008. There are two branch campus sites in Muskogee (approximately 19 miles from Warner and 50 miles from Tulsa). Degree programs are also provided at two correctional facilities near Muskogee. The college's athletic teams compete in the Bi-State Conference and in Region II. The college also has a nationally known Livestock Judging Team that annually is rated as one of the best in the nation. School colors are orange, black and white. The team nicknames are Cowboys and Cowgirls. The college is governed by the Oklahoma A&M Board of Regents. Dr. Donnie Nero is in his ninth year as the 13th president of CSC.*
