Cameron also offers degree programs and coursework for a variety of pre-professional degrees such as law, veterinary medicine, dentistry, architecture, engineering and medicine. The Cameron University ROTC program ranks in the top 15 percent of programs in the nation.

Academic calendar – Fall semester – August through early December; spring semester – January through early May; summer semester – June through July. Courses are offered in eight and 16-week sessions in the spring and fall and in four-week and eight-week sessions in the summer.

Fall intersession – Dec. 16 through Jan. 8; spring intersession – May 10 through May 28; summer intersession – July 24 through Aug 18.

Transfer Students

Minimum college GPA required – 2.0

Maximum credits transferable – Transfer credit from an accredited four-year higher education institution may be granted toward the completion of a degree. Up to 68 credit hours may be transferred from an accredited two-year higher education institution toward the completion of a degree. Students must complete a minimum of 30 credit hours from Cameron University to earn a degree from the university.

Items required for application – Application for admission, \$15 application fee, high school transcript and ACT/SAT scores if the student has less than 24 college credit hours, all transcripts from previously attended universities.

International Students

TOEFL test requirements: – TOEFL score report required if English is not the student's native language. Undergraduate students must score at least 173 (computer-based), 500 (paper-based), or 61 (Internet-based) and graduate students must score at least 213, 550, or 79-80 (respectively). Cameron also accepts the IELTS. Undergraduates must score at least 6.0 and graduate students must score at least 6.5.
