4 English (Grammar, Composition, Literature) 2 Lab Science (Biology, Chemistry, Physics or any lab science certified by the school district; General Science with or without a lab may not be used to meet this requirement.) 3 Mathematics (from Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, Trigonometry, Math Analysis, Calculus) 2 History (including one unit of American History) 1 Citizenship skills from the subjects of Economics, Geography, Government, Non-Western Culture. 3 Additional units of subjects previously listed or selected from the following – Computer Science, Foreign Language. 15 Required Units

While these curricular requirements will normally be met by students in grades 9 through 12, advanced students who complete these courses in earlier grades will not be required to take additional courses for purposes of admission.

Application process – Submit a completed application, non-refundable \$25 application fee, and all high school and college transcripts containing cumulative GPA, class rank, graduation date, and ACT or SAT score report.

Application deadlines – Open

Transfer Students

Minimum college GPA required – 2.0

Maximum credits transferable – Transfer students will receive credit for grades if they have earned a 2.0 or higher in specific core education courses. At least 30 hours must be completed at LU before a student can receive a degree.

Langston University is a public, four-year, liberal arts university located in the town of Langston. It is a northeast Oklahoma community with a population of about 3,467. LU is located in a rural residential setting about 42 miles northeast of Oklahoma City and 90 miles west of Tulsa.
