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Transfer Students

International Students

TOEFL test requirements – English proficiency with no English Language program: 500 or 173 on the computer-based TOEFL or 61 on the IBT (International TOEFL) or 6.0 on the IELTS. English Proficiency with 12 weeks of an English Language program: 460 or 140 on the computer-based TOEFL or 48 on the IBT or 5.0 on the IELTS.
