## ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

High school graduation – Required, GED accepted

### High school curriculum requirements

English - 4 units, Lab science - 2 units, Math - 3 units, History - 2 units, Citizenship skills - 1 unit, Foreign language – 2 units (strongly suggested)

Application process – Submit completed application and \$25 application fee, ACT or SAT score, Character Recommendation Form, current and completed high school transcripts containing cumulative GPA and class rank

Application deadlines – May 1 for fall (priority deadline)

### Transfer Students

Maximum credits transferable – 65 hours from a community college, other transfer credit accepted from regionally accredited college or university upon approval of Registrar

Items required for application – Official, completed high school and college transcripts
