## ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

ACT/SAT requirements – Participation in the ACT, SAT or similar acceptable battery of tests

High school graduation – Graduation from an accredited high school is required or a high school equivalency certificate based on the GED test.

High school GPA – Oklahoma City Community College maintains an open-door admissions policy that makes its programs available to as many students as possible. All regularly admitted students must meet high school curricular requirements or they will be required to take appropriate course work to remedy any existing deficiencies.

*Oklahoma City Community College is the fifth largest higher education institution in Oklahoma with an annual enrollment of nearly 20,000 students. Considered a landmark in the southwestern section of Oklahoma City, the college is located on 143 acres just south of Interstate 240 on South May Avenue. Founded in 1972, OCCC was established on the belief that everyone deserves an opportunity for a college education. A progressive two-year college, OCCC offers nearly 50 associate degree programs and numerous certificates of mastery. ## High school curriculum requirements

- 4 units English (grammar, composition, literature)
- 2 units Lab Science (biology, chemistry or physics)
- 3 units Mathematics (algebra, geometry, trigonometry, math analysis, calculus, or advanced placement statistics)
- 3 units History and Citizenship Skills (one unit of American History and two units from economics, geography, government or non-western culture)
- 3 additional units from subjects previously listed or from computer science, foreign language, or any advanced placement course except applied courses in fine arts

**Application process** – Students should complete an application for admission and submit it along with a high school transcript and ACT scores, if available, to the Office of Recruitment and Admissions.

**Application deadlines** – Prior to the registration deadline for each semester

## Transfer Students

**Minimum college GPA required** – Students transferring from other accredited colleges who are in good standing and have met all curricular requirements are eligible for admission to OCCC. Students not meeting retention standards may be admitted on probation.

**Maximum credits transferable** – All coursework previously completed at a regionally accredited institution of higher education will be accepted as transfer credit, although not all credit will necessarily apply toward program requirements.

**Items required for application** – Students should complete an application for admission and submit it along with official transcripts from all colleges attended.

## International Students

**TOEFL test requirements** – Minimum score of 500 on the institutional paper-based TOEFL (offered at OCCC), a minimum score of 173 on the international computer-based TOEFL or a minimum score of 61 on the TOEFL iBT. Students scoring within the range of 460 to 499 on the paper based TOEFL, 48 to 60 on the TOEFL iBT, 140 to 172 on the computer-based TOEFL, or 5.0 to 5.9 on the IELTS may be eligible to participate in the Academic Bridge Program. Students who successfully complete the Academic Bridge Program become eligible for full admission to the college without having to retake the TOEFL or IELTS.

To apply for scholarships, complete the scholarship application available in the Office of Recruitment and Admissions.

**Application deadlines** – Because some federal and state financial assistance program funds are awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis, it is best for students to complete and return the FAFSA as soon as tax returns for the previous year have been filed with the Internal Revenue Service.
