Associate in Applied Science

Applied Technology (emphasis in either aviation technology, computer-aided drafting, health technology, horticulture, industrial technology power generation or information technology); Business Administration Technology (emphasis in either accounting, administrative assistant, international business, management, medical coding and reimbursement or medical transcription); Child Development; Criminal Justice (emphasis in either collegiate officer program, corrections, emergency preparedness/homeland security, general studies in criminal justice or juvenile justice); Early Childhood Center Management; Equine Science; Nursing (RN); Sustainable Agriculture (emphasis in either enology or viticulture)

Associate in Science

Agriculture (emphasis in either agricultural communication, agricultural economics, pre-agriculture education, agronomy, animal science, equine science, enology, farm and ranch management, general agriculture, horticulture or viticulture); Athletic/Personal Trainer (emphasis in athletic trainer or personal trainer); Pre-Professional Sciences (emphasis in either life science, physical science, allied health science or mathematics).

Career Certificate Programs

Certificate of Mastery – Child Development; Certificate of Mastery – Enology or Viticulture
Class times offered – Daytime, evening, weekends and anytime learning online
