Application process – The final official high school transcript or GED must be sent directly from the high school or GED-testing agency to the Office of Admission. Applicants must submit completed application either online or via traditional form or the Common Application in lieu of its own form and a nonrefundable, one-time processing fee of \$35.

Application deadlines – Rolling admission policy, completed application files reviewed as they are received and applicants notified of the admission decision on an ongoing basis

## Transfer Students

Minimum college GPA required – 2.5

Maximum credits transferable – Last 45 hours of course work must be completed in residence at TU

Items required for application – Application form (TU or Common Application), \$35 nonrefundable fee, official transcripts and/or GED scores mailed to the Office of Admission from the high school or GED-testing agency and each accredited college attended.
