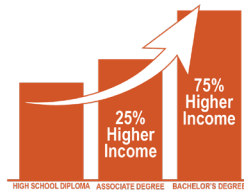
### HIGHER EDUCATION IN OKLAHOMA



Nearly **200,000** students enrolled annually



Over **38,000** degrees and certificates awarded at all levels in the last academic year, and an increase of **more than 6%** over the last decade



Associate and bachelor's degree holders earn a median income **25% and 75% higher**, respectively, than those with only a high school diploma.



Data from the National Center for Education Statistics show the cost of attendance at Oklahoma universities is **among the lowest in the nation**.



Over the last decade, STEM degrees **increased 22%** at all levels.



Our students learn here, earn here — **over 93%** of Oklahomans who graduate from a state system college or university remain and work in the state one year after graduation.



Only **28.5%** of Oklahoma citizens hold a bachelor's degree or higher. The national average is nearly 36%, and of our surrounding states — including Arkansas, New Mexico, Missouri, Texas, Kansas and Colorado — only Arkansas has a lower percentage of citizens with a bachelor's degree or higher.



Of Oklahoma's 100 critical occupations, the **top 22** highest-paying jobs require an associate degree or higher, and eight of the **top 10** fastest-growing jobs require a college degree.

## BY THE NUMBERS

### Enrollment

- ▶ During the 2023-24 academic year, 12,781 students enrolled at institutions in or adjacent to District 2.

### Graduation

- ▶ During the 2023-24 academic year, 2,630 students graduated from institutions in or adjacent to District 2.

### Oklahoma's Promise

- ▶ In District 2, 75 students from the 2024 high school graduating class qualified for the Oklahoma's Promise scholarship.
- ▶ Currently, 179 high school students in District 2 are enrolled in Oklahoma's Promise.
- ▶ Since inception in 1992, 1,675 high school students from District 2 have received the Oklahoma's Promise scholarship.
- ▶ During the 2023-24 academic year, nearly 1,000 students at public higher education institutions in or adjacent to District 2 received approximately \$4.6 million in scholarships from Oklahoma's Promise.

### Concurrent Enrollment

- ▶ During the 2023-24 academic year, 1,483 students enrolled in 15,943 credit hours through concurrent courses at institutions in or adjacent to District 2.
