
HIGHER EDUCATION IN OKLAHOMA



Nearly 200,000 students enrolled annually



Over 38,000 degrees and certificates awarded at all levels in the last academic year, and an increase of more than 6% over the last decade



Associate and bachelor's degree holders earn a median income 25% and 75% higher, respectively, than those with only a high school diploma.



Education Statistics show the cost of attendance at Oklahoma universities is among the lowest in the nation.

Over the last decade, STEM degrees increased 22% at all levels.



Our students learn here, earn here — over 93% of Oklahomans who graduate from a state system college or university remain and work in the state one year after graduation.



Only 28.5% of Oklahoma citizens hold a bachelor's degree or higher. The national average is nearly 36%, and of our surrounding states — including Arkansas, New Mexico, Missouri, Texas, Kansas and Colorado — only Arkansas has a lower percentage of citizens with a bachelor's degree or higher.



Of Oklahoma's 100 critical occupations, the **top 22** highest-paying jobs require an associate degree or higher, and eight of the **top 10** fastest-growing jobs require a college degree.

BY THE NUMBERS

Enrollment

During the 2023-24 academic year, 7,663 students enrolled at institutions in or adjacent to District 50.

Graduation

During the 2023-24 academic year, 1,087 students graduated from institutions in or adjacent to District 50.

Oklahoma's Promise

- In District 50, 95 students from the 2024 high school graduating class qualified for the Oklahoma's Promise scholarship.
- Currently, 263 high school students in District 50 are enrolled in Oklahoma's Promise.
- Since inception in 1992, 1,934 high school students from District 50 have received the Oklahoma's Promise scholarship.
- During the 2023-24 academic year, nearly 500 students at public higher education institutions in or adjacent to District 50 received approximately \$2.2 million in scholarships from Oklahoma's Promise.

Concurrent Enrollment

During the 2023-24 academic year, 2,029 students enrolled in 20,614 credit hours through concurrent courses at institutions in or adjacent to District 50.
