
# HIGHER EDUCATION IN OKLAHOMA



**Nearly 200,000** students enrolled annually



Over 38,000 degrees and certificates awarded at all levels in the last academic year, and an increase of more than 6% over the last decade



Associate and bachelor's degree holders earn a median income **25% and 75% higher**, respectively, than those with only a high school diploma.



Over the last decade, STEM degrees increased 22% at all levels.



Data from the National Center for Education Statistics show the cost of attendance at Oklahoma universities is among the lowest in the nation.



Our students learn here, earn here — over 93% of Oklahomans who graduate from a state system college or university remain and work in the state one year after graduation.



Only 28.5% of Oklahoma citizens hold a bachelor's degree or higher. The national average is nearly 36%, and of our surrounding states — including Arkansas, New Mexico, Missouri, Texas, Kansas and Colorado — only Arkansas has a lower percentage of citizens with a bachelor's degree or higher.



Of Oklahoma's 100 critical occupations, the **top 22** highest-paying jobs require an associate degree or higher, and eight of the **top 10** fastest-growing jobs require a college degree.

# BY THE NUMBERS

### **Enrollment**

During the 2023-24 academic year, 42,279 students enrolled at institutions in or adjacent to District 89.

### Graduation

During the 2023-24 academic year, 6,468 students graduated from institutions in or adjacent to District 89.

### Oklahoma's Promise

- In District 89, 278 students from the 2024 high school graduating class qualified for the Oklahoma's Promise scholarship.
- Currently, 756 high school students in District 89 are enrolled in Oklahoma's Promise.
- Since inception in 1992, 6,541 high school students from District 89 have received the Oklahoma's Promise scholarship.
- During the 2023-24 academic year, over 2,500 students at public higher education institutions in or adjacent to District 89 received approximately \$11.6 million in scholarships from Oklahoma's Promise.

### **Concurrent Enrollment**

During the 2023-24 academic year, 3,289 students enrolled in 25,670 credit hours through concurrent courses at institutions in or adjacent to District 89.
