## Joint Resolution No. 2 ADJUNCT FACULTY

**WHEREAS**, the number of part-time faculty in Oklahoma has increased from 2,426 (30.7 percent of all faculty) in 1991 to 3,223 (35.3 percent of all faculty) in 2001; and,

WHEREAS, many colleges and universities nationwide have filled vacated full-time faculty positions with part-time faculty in an effort to control costs during recent years of higher education budget reductions; and,

WHEREAS, Oklahoma faculty leaders have expressed concern about the increasing numbers of part-time faculty noting the possible impact on instructional quality, the increased non-teaching workload (such as advising students, serving on committees, and designing curricula) on full-time faculty, challenges to accreditation, benefit inequities for part-time faculty; and the need for hiring standards in the employment of adjunct faculty; and,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Student Advisory Board and the Faculty Advisory Council to the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education:

**THAT** the State Regents continue to encourage institutional creativity (such as training and mentoring) that will enhance quality at a time of increased enrollment demand and budget constraints.

**THAT** the State Regents include in their study of institutional benefit plans an analysis of benefits, or lack thereof, offered to Oklahoma part-time faculty.
