## Joint Resolution No. 4 RETENTION AND GRADUATION

WHEREAS, graduation rates at Oklahoma colleges and universities are below the national average for similar institutions across the country; and,

**WHEREAS**, student retention and graduation rates have substantially improved over the past few years; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of students, colleges and universities, and the general public for students learning to occur in an efficient and effective manner; and,

WHEREAS, the State Regents and Oklahoma colleges and universities have implemented numerous student preparation initiatives and performance funding to reward institutional improvement in retention and graduation rates; and,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Student Advisory Board and the Faculty Advisory Council to the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education:

**THAT** the State Regents continue focusing efforts and resources on retention and graduation rate improvement.

**THAT** efforts to improve and reward retention and graduation rates be carefully implemented and monitored to ensure that students and institutions serving under prepared, first-generation, and disadvantaged students receive appropriate assistance.
