FACULTY TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS, the 2000 Faculty Opinion survey indicates that faculty development and technology training are among the top five concerns, and;

WHEREAS, according to <u>The American College Teacher</u>, 67 percent of college and university faculty report that keeping up with information technology has proved to be stressful for them, and:

WHEREAS, on the national SHEEO faculty survey, technology use was the top issue, and;

WHEREAS, the Technology 2000 report recommends that regional centers for instructional development and faculty collaborative initiates aimed at content development be established, and;

WHEREAS, the State Regents have commenced several statewide technology development efforts in the form of grants, training programs, conferences, best practice identification, and the coordination of in-state and multi-state on-line curriculum development.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Student Advisory Board and the Faculty Advisory Committee to the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education:

- 1. That the State Regents continue to increase funding and pursue statewide initiatives for faculty technology development and infrastructure maintenance, support and upgrade.
- 2. That institutions be encouraged to use and organize student technology expertise to provide technology support for faculty and student peers.
- 3. That institutions be encouraged to adjust priorities and policies enabling faculty to update and reorganize instruction using technology tools for the classroom (e.g., summer school stipends and/or release time for course development, instructional design, awards).
