III. New Business

A. Updates from each campus:

- 1. Kathi Schoonover (Pre-Award, NSU)—Tiffany Wika moved to Michigan with her husband and Tiffany Biggers took her place. NSU was awarded several INBREs this year. It's been a busy year.
- 2. Yolanda Carr (SWOSU)—SWOSU was awarded several INBRES, received notice of at least 15 awards this month. In April, they submitted proposals for Title III, Parts A and F. They received a \$10,000 NEA grant along with a \$17,000 Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management grant for generators for their campus. At the SWOSU Research Fair, over 300 students and 50 faculty presented their work. In 2019 SWOSU will host Oklahoma Research Day.
- 3. Dr. Linda Mason (OSRHE)—The annual grant report will available by request. Grant funding has increased from \$240 million in 2004 to almost \$700 million at present. She also stated the importance of CGR and its meetings. Oklahoma has nine out of eleven federal NASNTI grants. The federal director will be coming to OSRHE to meet with the program directors. In the fall (September 30th), the Regents will be hosting Undergraduate Research Day. Dr. Mason is now part-time at the Regents but she is available to hold workshops or for consultation. She is available by email or text.
- Rachel Waldrop Holzhauser (UCO)—Had 38 faculty on campus with grant submissions with a total of requested funds of \$250,000. Patent applications updated. UCO will host NCUR next April with five conference workshops. Liliana Renteria has moved to a Director position elsewhere at UCO.
- 5. Susan Evans (Post-Award, NSU)—Sheri Shatswell unable to attend meeting because of the loss of her mother and NSU is grateful that everyone was willing to change the meeting time so they could attend the funeral.
