HIGHLIGHTS

For the purposes of this report, the term "research universities" includes OU and OSU; the term "four-year universities" includes the eleven regional universities (UCO, ECU, NSU, SEOSU, SWOSU, Cameron, Langston, NWOSU, Panhandle, RSU and USAO). "Constituent agencies" refer to the OU Health Sciences Center, the OU Law Center, the OSU Agriculture Experiment Station, the OSU Cooperative Extension Service, the OSU College of Veterinary Medicine, the OSU Center for Health Sciences, OSU-Tulsa, OSU Technical Branch at Okmulgee and OSU Oklahoma City.

Average Salary: The average salary for all full-time faculty equated to a 9-10 month basis in Oklahoma state-supported colleges and universities, excluding the constituent agencies, is \$67,819 for the year 2015-2016 (Table 1). This is an increase of \$337 or 0.5 percent above 2014-2015.

Increase/Decrease by Type of Institution: Average salaries increased \$665 at the research universities, decreased by \$411 at the four-year universities, and a decrease of \$218 at the two-year colleges. These salaries represent changes of 0.8 percent-research, -0.7 percent—four-year, and -0.4 percent—two-year, over 2014-2015.

Increase/Decrease by Rank: Among the three categories of institutions, the rank of Assistant Professor showed the greatest dollar increase over 2014-15--\$2,148 or 3.5 percent. All other percent changes in salaries range from decreases of \$830 or. 0.8 percent for Professors, to and increase of \$789 or 1.1 percent for Professors. (see Figure 2).

Total Faculty: Total full-time faculty in 2015-2016 is 5,106 an increase of 39 or 0.8 percent over 2014-15 (Figure 1). The total number of faculty when the constituent agencies are added is 6,764 an increase of 515 or 8.3 percent.

Salary Range: Full-time salaries on a 9-10 month basis in the 25 institutions in 2015-2016 range from a minimum of \$15,302, compared to \$22,713 as a low in 2014-2015, to a maximum of \$303,867, compared to \$298,863 in 2014-15 (Table 9). On an 11-12 month basis, full-time salaries range from a minimum of \$4,725, a decrease of \$4,050 from the low in 2014-2015, to a maximum of \$425,004, the same high salary as in 2014-2015. These data exclude salaries for deans and other administrative personnel.

Increase in Benefits: The average fringe benefits paid for faculty on a 9-10 month contract basis for 2015-2016 are \$23,727, a slight decrease over 2014-2015 of \$162, or 10.7 percent (Table 5); for faculty on an 11-12 month contract basis, average benefits total \$30,849, a decrease of \$577 or 1.8 percent (Table 7).

Oklahoma Average Salaries Compared to National: Research universities' average salary is 90.33 percent of the national average, compared to 89.64 percent in 2014-2015. In all ranks the average rate for Oklahoma has increased, by 7.1 percent, from the 2014-15 average to 86.11 percent. (Table 17)

NOTE: The changes in average salaries are only partially related to salary actions by governing boards. Other factors, such as resignations and retirements, can have an impact as well, particularly if new junior faculty are hired at lower salaries to replace departing senior faculty.

TABLE 1

Table 1 presents the 2015-2016 average salaries paid all full-time faculty by rank and by all 25 colleges and universities in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. These data include salaries of full-time faculty employed on a 9-10 month contract basis and full-time faculty employed on an 11-12 month contract basis with salaries equated to 9-10 months. Table 1 also includes the number of full-time faculty by rank and by institution.

The average salary equated to a 9-10 month basis paid in the 25 institutions in 2015-2016 is \$67,819. This represents an increase over 2014-2015 of \$337 or 0.5 percent (see Figure 2). The average for research universities is \$85,410, for four-year universities, \$59,225, and for two-year colleges, \$49,285. These salaries represent increases over 2014-2015 0.8 percent and decreases of 0.7 percent, respectively, for the research and regional universities and a 0.4 percent decrease for the two-year colleges. The 2015-2016 median of all institutions' average salaries is \$50,791.

Average salaries for instructors are highest at the two-year colleges, and lowest at the four-year universities.

Faculty distribution by rank may influence the salary averages of the various faculty ranks within an institution. Table 1 shows a smaller proportion of faculty in the upper two ranks (professor and associate professor) at four-year universities than at the research universities. The research universities' average salary for all ranks is 30.7 percent higher than the average salary of all ranks for four-year universities. By rank, the research universities' average salary exceeds the four-year universities' average salary in the rank of professor by 33.8 percent, associate professor by 22.1 percent, and assistant professor by 26.9 percent. However, in the rank of instructor, the two-year universities' average salary exceeds the system average salary by 5.0 percent.


The total number of full-time faculty reported in the 25 institutions in 2015-2016 is 5,106—2,173 at research universities, 1,922 at four-year universities, and 1,011 at two-year colleges. These figures compare to a total of 5,067-2,109; 1,946; and 1,012 at the research, four-year and two-year tiers, respectively in 2015.






CHANGE IN NUMBER OF FULL-TIME FACULTY 2014-2015 TO 2015-2016




CHANGE IN SALARIES OF FULL-TIME FACULTY 2014-2015 TO 2015-2016

Table 2 presents the 9-10 month average salaries of all full-time faculty members for the three years, 2012-13 through 2015-2016, from which salary trends by institution and by rank may be analyzed.

Certain factors may influence salary averages so that they do not accurately indicate long-term salary trends. For example: a senior full professor receiving a top salary could retire and at the same time an associate professor be promoted to full professor at the bottom of the salary scale for full professors. The net result, with respect to individual faculty still employed, would be that at least one person would be receiving more salary than in the previous year. Yet, the effect upon the average salary for full professors at the institution would show a decline. The average salary for an entire institution could be affected in the same manner. Another factor causing the same effect could occur as a result of hiring new faculty to meet the demands of expanding enrollment; new faculty members would normally be hired at a salary level below the institution's salary average. Several of the state system institutions are showing a decline in salary due to the aforementioned factors.

Analyses of the data contained in Table 2 may be made in a variety of meaningful ways. No attempt is made here to provide an exhaustive analysis; however, certain observations are noted. The dollar increases in average salaries are not the same between different ranks in the same institution. For example, changes for 2013-14 to 2015-2016 show the University of Oklahoma increased the average of all ranks \$3,572 or 4.3 percent, while Oklahoma State University increased \$2,353 or 2.9 percent. At Oklahoma State University, the salary for the rank of professor decreased by \$781; the increase for associate professors was

\$4,403; the increase for assistant professor was \$7,079; and the rank of instructor showed an increase of \$1,851. At the University of Oklahoma, comparable figures were changes of \$5,481 \$5,019 \$4,128, and \$1,633 for professors, associate professors, assistant professors and instructors, respectively. Such differences may result from factors suggested above or could also result from salary administration policy and faculty qualifications as well as the number of positions represented in each rank. Although Table 2 does not provide specific reasons for observed salary averages and comparisons, the three-year trend of institutions' average salaries by rank may provide helpful data.




Table 3 presents the average salaries of all full-time faculty members equated to a 9-10 month basis for the three years, 2013-2014 through 2015-2016, classified by rank and by type of institution.

Dollar increases in average annual salaries of all ranks in 2015-2016 over 2014-2015 are greatest for the research universities, The four-year universities, and for two-year colleges show declines. The changes in averages of all ranks by type of institution in 2015-2016 over 2014-15 were \$665, -\$411, and -\$218 for research universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, respectively. The average salary at research universities was \$25,110 greater than the average at four-year universities in 2014-2015, and \$26,185 greater in 2015-2016. The average salary at four-year universities was \$9,940 greater than the average at two-year colleges in 2015-2016, and \$10,133 greater in 2014-2015.

Averages by rank show that research universities' faculty receive higher salaries than four-year universities' faculty in the all ranks in 2015-2016. Instructors at two-year colleges receive higher average salaries than instructors at both research universities and four-year universities.

Over the three-year period, the percentage increase in average salaries for all ranks was largest for research faculty (1.8%), and least for two-year faculty, (0.6%) and research universities showed an increase percentage of (0.9%.)

The annual increases in average salaries for 2014-2015 and 2015-2016 for research universities have been an increase of 2.9 and 0.8 percent. The four-year universities experienced increases of 2.4 percent in 2014-2015 and -0.7 percent decrease in 2015-2016, with an average of 0.9 percent. The two-year colleges experienced a 0.4 percent increase in 2015-2016 and a 0.7 percent increase in 2014-2015, with an average increase of 0.6 percent.

Table 4 presents the average salaries and the number of full-time faculty employed on a 9-10 month basis only. Faculty who are employed on an 11-12 month basis are not included in this table. Individual faculty members included in Table 4 may or may not be employed by separate contract for summer teaching. The criterion for inclusion in Table 4 is that the basic contract is for a regular 9-10 month academic year. Whereas many interpretations may be made from data in Table 4 alone, depth may be gained by comparing the data with those contained in Tables 1 and 6.

The average salary paid in the 25 institutions in 2015-2016 to 9-10 month employed faculty is \$67,621. This represents an decrease from 2014-2015 of \$67 or 0.1%. As is true with other consolidated data in this report, the research universities exert heavy influence on this average, as they claim more than one-third of the faculty and their average is 42.7 percent higher than that of the four-year universities. Likewise, within the two-year tier, Tulsa Community College employs just over one quarter of the total faculty and shows an average salary 16.6 percent above the mean. This influence is indicated by observing that the average salary for the research universities is \$83,652 the average salary for four-year universities is \$58,611 and the average salary for two-year colleges is \$49,235. The 2015-2016 median of all institutions' average salaries is \$50,048.

Table 4 reveals that the research universities report a lower average salary for the ranks of professor employed on a 9-10 month contract when compared to the average shown in Table 1. The data for the research universities reflect a higher average monthly rate of pay for 11-12 month contract faculty (Table 6) than average monthly salary rates for 9-10 month contract faculty. The same is true of the data for four-year universities and two-year colleges, which both reflect a higher average monthly salary rate of pay for 11-12 month contract faculty (Table 6) than average monthly salary rates for 9-10 month contract faculty at all ranks.

The number of full-time faculty employed on a 9-10 month contract in 2015-2016 is 4,495. This number represents 88.0 percent of the total full-time faculty in the 25 institutions. In 2014-2015, the number was 4,472 or 88.3 percent of the total. In 2015-2016, four-year universities employ 91.2 percent of their full-time faculty on a 9-10 month basis. The two-year colleges employ 90.9 percent on a 9-10 month basis. The two research universities combined employ 83.9 percent of their full-time faculty on a 9-10 month basis.




CHANGE IN NUMBER OF 9-10 MONTH FULL-TIME FACULTY

2014-2015 TO 2015-2016











CHANGE IN SALARIES OF 9-10 MONTH FULL-TIME FACULTY 2014-2015 TO 2015-2016










Table 5 presents the average fringe benefits on a 9-10 month basis paid to or on behalf of all 9-10 month full-time faculty by all 25 colleges and universities in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. The average fringe benefits paid for 2015-2016 is \$23,727, a decrease over 2014-2015 of \$162 or 0.7 percent.

Fringe benefits as a percent of average salaries may be computed from the data in Tables 4 and 5. For all institutions, 2015-2016 fringe benefits are 35.1 percent of the average salary; compared to the same percent in 2014-2015. For the research universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, the fringe benefits for 2015-2016 as a percent of average salaries are 33.6 percent, 33.9 percent, and 45.4 percent, respectively. Comparative percentages for 2014-2015 were 33.9 percent, 34.2 percent, and 44.3 percent, respectively.

Retirement plan payments are the largest fringe benefit for all institutions combined. 2015-2016 payments comprise 50.4 percent of the average total fringe benefits for the State System, a slight increase from the 50.0 percent in 2014-2015. For the research universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, retirement plan payments are 56.3 percent, 42.4 percent, and 49.4 percent, respectively, of the total average fringe benefits. Comparable 2014-2015 figures were 56.1 percent, 42.3 percent, and 48.7 percent, respectively (see Figure 5).

Social security taxes are the second largest fringe benefit paid by institutions and are required by law, as are unemployment compensation and worker's compensation payments.


All institutions provide medical and life insurance benefits and 21 institutions provide other fringe benefits not specifically identified.






Table 6 presents the average salaries and the number of full-time faculty employed in the 25 institutions on an 11-12 month basis only.

The average salary paid in the 25 institutions in 2015-2016 to 11-12 month employed faculty is \$97,497, an increase over 2014-2015 of \$3,354 or 3.6 percent. The average 11-12 month salary for research universities is \$115,620; the average for four-year universities is \$80,124; and the average for two-year colleges is \$60,852. The 2015-2016 median of the average salaries for 22 institutions reporting 11-12 month full-time faculty is \$63,721.

The number of full-time faculty employed on an 11-12 month contract basis is 611 or 12.0 percent of the total full-time faculty in the 25 institutions. In 2014-2015 the number was 595 or 11.8 percent. The percent of faculty employed on an 11-12 month basis is 16.1 percent at research universities; 8.9 percent at four-year universities, and 9.1 percent at two-year colleges. The number of full-time faculty employed on an 11-12 month basis varies by institution. For example, nine institutions employ five or less faculty on an 11-12 month basis; while over 38.17 percent of Langston University's faculty (50 out of 131) is employed on an 11-12 month basis.

CHANGE IN NUMBER OF 11-12 MONTH FULL-TIME FACULTY 2014-2015 TO 2015-2016












CHANGE IN SALARIES OF 11-12 MONTH FULL-TIME FACULTY 2014-2015 TO 2015-2016









Table 7 represents the 2015-2016 average fringe benefits on an 11-12 month basis to or on behalf of all 11-12 month full-time faculty by all 25 institutions in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. The average fringe benefit paid for 2015-2016 is \$30,849 and represents a decrease of \$577 or 1.8 percent.

Fringe benefits as a percent of average salaries may be computed from the data in Tables 6 and 7. For all institutions, 2015-2016 fringe benefits are 31.6 percent of the average salary, a decrease from 33.4 percent in 2014-2015. For the research universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, the fringe benefits as a percent of average salaries are 31.8 percent, 30.8 percent, and 32.1 percent, respectively. Comparable 2014-2015 figures were 33.5 percent, 32.9 percent, and 31.9 percent, respectively.

Retirement plan payments are the largest fringe benefit for all institutions combined. Such payments comprise 57.5 percent of the average total fringe benefits for the State System for 2015-2016 as compared with 57.9 percent for 2014-2015. For the research universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, the payments are 58.9 percent, 49.9 percent, and 67.0 percent, respectively, of the total average fringe benefits. Comparable figures for 2014-2015 were 57.4 percent, 56.2 percent, and 67.2 percent respectively (see Figure 8).

Social security taxes are the second largest fringe benefit paid by institutions and are required by law, as are unemployment compensation and worker's compensation payments.








Table 8 presents the 2015-2016 average total compensation paid to the full-time faculty on both 9-10 month and 11-12 month contracts by all 25 institutions in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education.

Average total compensation for 9-10 month faculty in 2015-2016 is \$91.349 compared with \$91,577 in 2014-2015, and represents a decrease of \$228 or 0.2 percent. The 2015-2016 average for research universities is \$111,780, for four-year universities, \$78,481, and for two-year colleges, \$71,597. The median of the average total compensation for all 25 institutions reporting is \$71,723.

Average total compensation for 11-12 month faculty in 2015-2016 is \$128,346 compared with \$125,569 in 2014-2015, and represents an increase of \$2,777 or 2.2 percent. The 2015-2016 average for research universities is \$152,363, for four-year universities, \$104,793, and for two-year colleges, \$80,378. The median of the average total compensation of the 22 institutions reporting 11-12 month faculty is \$86,696.






Table 9 presents the highest and lowest salaries paid to academic deans and full-time faculty classified both by contract period and by type of institution. The number of individuals and the number of institutions in each classification are also presented.

The average (mean) salaries for academic deans employed on an 11-12 month contract basis in 2015-2016 for the three classifications of institutions are: research universities, \$240,036; four-year universities, \$113,918; and two-year colleges, \$73,812 For 2014-2015 the average salaries were \$242,173, \$113,776, and \$68,352, respectively. Average salaries for academic deans in 2015-2016, decreased 0.9 percent at the research universities, and increased 0.1 percent at the regional universities and 8.0 at the two-year colleges.

The highest salary paid academic deans in the 25 institutions on an 11-12 month contract basis in 2015-2016 is \$378,446 for research universities, \$201,900 for four-year universities, and \$96,345 for two-year colleges. The highest salary for these categories in 2014-2015 was \$378,446, \$201,900, and \$96,345 for the research universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, respectively. The 2015-2016 lowest salary for academic deans is \$154,440 for research universities, \$55,709 for four-year universities, and \$44,289 for two-year colleges. The lowest salaries for these categories in 2014-2015, were \$161,118; \$55,709; and \$50,140, respectively.

For full-time faculty on 9-10 month contracts in the state system, the highest salary paid in 2015-2016 is \$303,867, compared to \$298,863 2014-2015. The lowest salary is \$15,302, compared to \$22,713 in 2014-2015.

For 2015-2016, the highest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on a 9-10 month contract basis by a four-year university is \$139,380, compared to \$129,380 in 2014-2015. The lowest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on a 9-10 month contract basis by a four-year university in 2015-2016 is \$15,479, compared to the same in 2014-2015. For two-year colleges, the 2015-2016 high is \$86,779 compared to the same in 2014-2015. Finally, the 2015-2016 low two-year college salary is \$24,000, compared to \$25,700 in 2014-2015.

The highest salary paid an 11-12 month contract full-time faculty member in the 25 institutions in 2015-2016 is \$425,004, compared to the same in 2014-2015. The lowest salary in 2015-2016 is \$4,725 compared to \$8,775 in 2014-2015. For 2015-2016, the highest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on an 11-12 month contract basis by a four-year university is \$163,392, the same as in 2014-2015; the lowest salary in 2015-2016 is \$36,997, compared to \$32,961 in 2014-2015. For 2015-2016, the highest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on an 11-12 month contract basis by a two-year college is \$85,971, as compared to the same in 2014-2015; the lowest salary is \$32,526 compared to \$30,000 in 2014-2015. These data exclude academic deans.

Table 10 presents income earned by full-time faculty members from activities that are specifically authorized by the institution in addition to primary employment duties. Income from summer-term employment for faculty employed on a 9-10 month contract basis is excluded from Table 10. These data are presented as "actual" for the completed year of 2014-2015 and "estimated" for the current year, 2015-2016.

The "estimated" average mean income in the 25 institutions from extra teaching assignments and approved non-institutional employment for 2015-2016 is \$5,706 for those faculty members earning such income. The "actual" figure for 2014-2015 was \$5,928. In 2015-2016, the median of the "estimated" averages is \$4,952; in 2015-2016, the median of the "actual" averages was \$5,546. In 2015-2016, the highest "estimated" average income from extra assignments is \$12,000; in 2014-2015, the highest "actual" average was \$11,565.

2014-2015 TO 2015-2016




Table 11 presents 2015-2016 salary data for selected administrative positions on an 11-12 month employment period by type of institution. The positions selected for inclusion are those most commonly staffed at higher education institutions. The average amount of fringe benefits is also included in the table. In some institutions, one individual may hold two or more administrative titles. In these instances, the salary has been reported under that heading most commonly associated with the highest salary.

Research University presidents' salaries average \$398,604 in 2015-2016, the same as in 2014-2015. Fringe benefits for the president average \$101,488.

Four-year university presidents receive an average salary of \$203,722 in 2015-2016, up from \$200,780 in 2014-2015 average salary. The highest salary for a four-year university president in 2015-2016 is \$280,000, compared to \$279,000 in 2014-2015. Fringe benefits average \$52,407 or 25.7 percent of the average salary.

Two-year college presidents receive an average salary of \$177,940 in 2015-2016, down slightly from the 2014-2015 average salary of \$175,861. The highest salary for a two-year college president in 2015-2016 is \$270,000, compared to the same in 2014-2015. Fringe benefits average \$59,815 or 33.6 percent of the average salary (see Figure 11).

College and university vice presidents' salary information include those positions surveyed in the Administrative Compensation Survey from the College and University Personnel Association (CUPA). These positions surveyed at the Vice President level are: Chief Academic Officer, Chief Business Officer, Chief Development Officer, and Chief Student Affairs Officer.



TABLES 12, 13, and 14

Tables 12, 13, and 14 present average salaries and fringe benefits of eight constituent agencies in the state higher education system. Each of the constituent agencies is unique with respect to average salary rates or professional classification. Consequently, salary data for each of the eight agencies are presented separately.

The University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center average salaries are presented on an 11-12 month contract basis. The College of Medicine 2015-2016 average salary is \$85,699. The College of Dentistry 2015-2016 average salary is \$91,251. The College of Nursing 2015-2016 average salary is \$69,589. The College of Public Health 2015-2016 average salary is \$103,266. The College of Allied Health 2015-2016 average salary is \$70,417. The College of Pharmacy 2015-2016 average salary is \$102,728. The Tulsa Branch College of Medicine 2015-2016 average salary is \$99,233. The Tulsa Branch, College of Nursing average salary is \$56,788. The Tulsa Branch, College of Pharmacy average salary is \$101,357 and finally, The Tulsa Branch College of Allied Health average salary is \$75,876.

<u>The University of Oklahoma Law Center</u> full-time faculty average salary on a 9-10 month equivalent contract basis for 2015-2016 is \$127,168 a 7.0 percent decrease from 2014-2015.

<u>The Oklahoma State University College of Veterinary Medicine</u> full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 2015-2016 of \$129,738 is a very slight decrease percent from 2014-2015.

The Oklahoma State University Agricultural Experiment Station full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 2015-2016 of \$103,537 is an increase of 1.38 percent over 2014-2015.

The Oklahoma State University Cooperative Extension Service full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 2015-2016 of \$107,682 is a decrease of 3.4 percent under 2014-2015.

The Oklahoma State University Center for Health Sciences full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 2015-2016 of \$209,400, an increase of 4.5 in 2014-2015. Inverse relationships to salary and rank can attributed to the fact that the Ph.D. faculty is the highest ranking, while the physicians are the lowest ranking yet higher salaried individuals.

The Oklahoma State University Technical Branch, Okmulgee full-time faculty average salary on an 9-10 month contract basis for 2015-2016 of \$55,134, an increase of 0.5% as in 2014-2015.

The Oklahoma State University, Oklahoma City full-time faculty average salary on a 9-10 month contract basis for 2015-2016 of \$51,224, a decrease 2.3% from 2014-2015.

Tables 15 and 16 illustrate the number and average salaries of new full-time faculty hired in 2015-2016, as well as the number and average salaries of full-time faculty terminations in 2015-2016. A total of 275 faculty retired, resigned, or were terminated, while an additional 320 faculty were hired. "Terminated Faculty" on Table 16 includes faculty who departed for any of the noted reasons (retired or resigned).

When comparing average salaries of new faculty hires to faculty terminations, new faculty salaries were 27.3 percent lower at the research universities, and 3.3 percent higher at four-year universities, and 8.4 at two-year colleges. The system average is 4.5 percent lower for new hires compared to terminated faculty.

It is significant that the average salary of new hired professors is higher at the research universities than the average salary of the professor rank as a whole (Table 15 vs. Table 1). At OSU, for example, at the professor level, new hires' average salary is \$136,501, compared to \$115,020 average salary of currently employed professors. At OU, at the associate professor level, new hires average \$113,664, compared to \$80,056 average salary of currently employed associate professors. At the regional universities, newcomers' average salaries are higher than the average salaries for all ranks, yet lower for the rank of instructor.

Table 17 illustrates average salaries by rank and by tier of Oklahoma institutions compared to national averages.

Oklahoma has made significant strides in bringing faculty salaries up to the national average. Oklahoma professors' salaries are at 99.94 percent of the national average (\$100,029 compared to \$100,085), associate professors are 93.02 percent of the national average (\$72,214 compared to \$77,636), and assistant professors are 93.9 percent of the national average (\$63,500 compared to \$67,623). Oklahoma instructor's salaries are lower than the national average. (\$46,980 compared to \$52,806, or 88.97 percent)

Assistant Professors at Oklahoma's research universities have seen the largest 10-year growth in average salary, 33.8 percent, just slightly higher than professors, when compared to other ranks and other tiers. Nationally, assistant professors' salaries at research universities grew by 30.6 percent, by comparison.

Overall, average Oklahoma salaries of all ranks have increased 22.4 percent over the 10-year period compared to 15.1 percent nationally, bringing Oklahoma average faculty salaries to 86.11 percent of the national average.

Figure 12 shows the annual percentage increases in average faculty salaries in Oklahoma and the nation over a 10-year period for each tier of institutions. Research universities have shown the greatest average annual percent increase at 2.5 percent. Overall, Oklahoma's average annual increase was 2.3 percent, compared to the national average of only 0.8 percent.

Figure 13 shows annual percentage increases in faculty salaries in Oklahoma and the nation over a 10-year period by faculty rank. Assistant professors received the largest average annual increase, 2.8 percent, compared to 2.0 percent nationally. Average annual increases in Oklahoma for professors, associate professors, and instructors were 2.4 percent, 2.2 percent, and 2.8 percent, respectively.














