#### 2. Tuition Benefits Survey: Lauren Pettigrew

a. Cass Minx welcomed new member of the OSHRE Workforce and Economic Development team, Lauren Pettigrew. Pettigrew then opened with an overview of <u>OSHRE's Tuition Benefit Assistance page</u>, that showcases employers that have college tuition assistance to students in Oklahoma. Pettigrew noted that this information is collected via survey and that this survey can be shared to the group as well as business partners to complete to showcase their tuition assistance. Pettigrew mentioned that OSRHE would be sharing a marketing package with social media content for institutions to share at their discretion.

# 3. Every Student is Undecided: Helping Students Navigate College and How to Choose a Major: Travis Lightsey, Director of Career Services, Rose State College

a. Travis Lightsey presented to the council where he discussed practical approaches to assist students in deciding a career path. Lightsey covered areas of research in decision making for college students that include cognition and brain development, practices institutions can implement to aid in the decision-making process that creates a clear career path, and understanding how to empower students with information on career choices that best meet their needs. Lightsey noted that it is important to have a holistic approach to students by considering personality types, decision-making styles, career goals, and personal goals to best direct a student to an area of interest. Lightsey also encouraged members to share useful tools amongst the council that help in coaching students towards a career path.
