ROLE OF THE STATE REGENTS



Oklahoma's constitutional state system of higher education was created in 1941 by a vote of the people. The State Regents fulfill a variety of responsibilities, including prescribing academic standards for higher education, determining functions and courses of study at state colleges and universities, and granting degrees. The State Regents allocate funding for each public institution, establish tuition and fees within limits set by the Oklahoma Legislature, and manage numerous scholarships and special programs.

The State Regents operate OneNet, the state's advanced research and education network, and the Oklahoma College Assistance Program, which provides important college access, financial literacy and student loan management programs and services that support students and the campus financial aid community.

Although the State Regents are the coordinating board of control for all institutions in the Oklahoma state system of higher education, governing boards of regents and boards of trustees are responsible for the operation of each state system institution and higher education program.

We continue working to implement the bold strategies outlined in *Blueprint 2030: Innovating* and *Elevating Oklahoma Higher Education for Tomorrow's Workforce*, the State Regents' strategic plan. *Blueprint 2030* is focusing our efforts to meet state workforce needs and effectively, efficiently leverage system resources.

Public higher education prioritizes innovation. Oklahoma was the first state system in the nation to establish a committee to study the impact of artificial intelligence (AI) on higher education. In 2024, the State Regents approved groundbreaking AI degree programs at three of our institutions—the first undergraduate AI degrees in Oklahoma.

These initiatives reflect the state system's dedication to advancement and responsiveness to emerging workforce needs. More than 19,000 Oklahoma jobs require AI skills, and industry projections anticipate 21% growth in AI-related positions across our state over the next decade, particularly in the health care, finance, manufacturing, and aerospace sectors.

The State Regents remain committed to increasing college degree completion in high-demand fields to position Oklahoma for long-term economic growth and Oklahomans for career success.

HIGHER EDUCATION UPDATE



As I begin my tenure as chancellor of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, I celebrate the remarkable progress of our state system in 2024. Several significant accomplishments demonstrate our commitment to expanding Oklahoma's educated workforce and creating more educational opportunities for individual Oklahomans.

In 2024, we enhanced our partnership with Oklahoma CareerTech through statewide nursing articulation agreements establishing guidelines for public two-year colleges and four-year universities to award students credit for prior learning in practical nursing programs at technology centers. These collaborations will empower more students to advance in the healthcare profession, escalating solutions to address our state's critical nursing shortage.

In April 2024, faculty and staff from colleges and universities across the state participated in a free speech training event hosted by the State Regents' Oklahoma Free Speech Committee. The committee reviews state system

institutions' free speech policies and complaints of free speech violations; examines free speech training programs at individual institutions; and provides free speech training every two years for campus personnel who create free speech policies or handle free speech complaints.

Through our nationally recognized Course Equivalency Project, which includes more than 8,100 courses across 48 disciplines, we've established Oklahoma as a national leader in transfer success. We're committed to creating seamless pathways for students to achieve their education goals efficiently and affordably. Eliminating barriers to enrollment and degree completion is key to meeting the goals outlined in our *Blueprint 2030* strategic plan.

We thank our legislators and Governor Stitt for investing in Oklahoma's future with a 1.99% increase in state appropriations in FY25. Our state system FY25 budget directly aligns with our priorities — to offer an exceptional higher education opportunity at an affordable cost while producing the graduates required to meet the state's most pressing workforce needs, including engineering, computer science, nursing, other STEM disciplines, and teaching.

We're also deeply grateful for the substantial funding to address deferred maintenance on our college and university campuses. As a past university president, I've seen firsthand how quality facilities impact student success.

The strength of our public higher education system shows in enrollment and employment outcomes. 2024 marked the state system's fourth consecutive year of enrollment growth, with a 4.5% increase from fall 2023 to fall 2024. Even more encouraging, our students learn here, then earn here. Over 93% of Oklahomans who graduate from a state system institution remain and work in the state one year after earning their degrees.


As we move forward together, I'm inspired by the dedicated leadership of our State Regents. In May 2024, Tulsa resident Ken Levit was sworn in as a State Regent. Levit, who succeeded State Regent Emeritus Ann Holloway, is serving a nine-year term expiring in May 2033.

Our accomplishments in public higher education create meaningful opportunities for Oklahoma families and produce a forward-thinking workforce prepared to compete and excel on a global stage. STATE SYSTEM FAST FACTS



Associate and bachelor's degree holders earn a median income 25% and 75% higher, respectively, than those with only a high school diploma.



Over the last decade, STEM degrees increased 22% at all levels.



Data show Oklahoma state system institutions generate an average return on investment of **nearly \$870,000 per graduate** over a career lifetime.



Data from the National Center for Education Statistics show the cost of attendance at Oklahoma universities is among the lowest in the nation.



Our students learn here, earn here — **over 93%** of Oklahomans who graduate from a state system college or university remain and work in the state one year after graduation.

KEY INITIATIVES

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

OKLAHOMA'S PROMISE

Oklahoma's Promise is recognized as one of America's best college access programs and is considered a model that combines emphases on academic preparation and financial support for college. Almost 15,000 students received Oklahoma's Promise scholarships in the last academic year.



CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

The concurrent enrollment program allows eligible juniors and seniors to earn college credit while still in high school, which strengthens student preparation, reduces family college costs, and decreases the time required to complete a degree. More than 19,000 students enrolled in concurrent courses, generating over 177,000 credit hours in the last academic year.



OKCOLLEGESTART.ORG

The state's web-based college and career planning portal has nearly 117,000 active accounts across the state and offers extensive information and tools to help students, parents and adult learners prepare, plan and pay for college. OKcollegestart serves as an ICAP administration platform for K-12 educators and features robust career planning resources, including career profiles that outline higher education requirements and expected salaries.



GEAR UP

Oklahoma GEAR UP (Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs) is the fifth consecutive federally funded grant program administered by the State Regents. GEAR UP is designed to prepare middle and high school students for college success through direct student support services, including college campus tours, ACT preparation and testing, college exploration courses, one-on-one guidance from school site directors, and Oklahoma's Promise and FAFSA completion assistance.



OKLAHOMA TEACHER CONNECTION

Through collaborative partnerships and strategically focused efforts, the Oklahoma Teacher Connection (OTC) supports initiatives and programs designed to recruit, retain and place teachers in Oklahoma classrooms. Supporting PK-12 and higher education, in addition to professional development opportunities, OTC has directly impacted thousands of educators and students through professional development, curriculum, policy, scholarships and incentive programs.



INSPIRED TO TEACH

Inspired to Teach allows eligible students who declare teacher education as a college major to receive a scholarship during undergraduate matriculation and an incentive award for committing to teach five consecutive years in an Oklahoma public school, for a total of up to \$25,500 in scholarships and employment incentives.



KEY INITIATIVES

ADULT LEARNERS

REACH HIGHER

Through the Reach Higher program, 27 institutions provide specialized advising and support systems to help adult students re-enroll in college and complete degrees that lead to careers in Oklahoma's critical industries. The program also offers financial assistance, awarding over \$5.5 million in scholarships to eligible adult learners in summer and fall 2024, thanks in part to the Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER) funds. Since inception, Reach Higher has helped students earn more than 11,000 degrees.



ShowWhatYouKnowOK.org is a dedicated website that empowers students to determine how previously earned college credit, licenses, certifications, military training, advanced standing scores, and knowledge gained through other learning experiences can be applied toward a college degree.

UPSKILLOK

UpskillOK, the State Regents' microcredentials initiative, continues to build a statewide framework of more than 450 microcredential programs offered by 26 public college and university campuses with over 160 industry partners. Micro-credentials help individuals adapt and succeed, equipping both students pursuing a degree and current degree-holders with specific career skillsets, competencies, and knowledge that can be readily transferred to fill critical workforce needs. More than 11,000 micro-credentials have been awarded since the first program launched in May 2022.










GRADUATION RATES FOR NEW OKLAHOMA FRESHMEN


Over the last 10 years, graduation rates have increased at all institutional tiers. Degree and certificate production at our public colleges and universities increased 8.1% over the last decade.


