
HIGHER EDUCATION IN OKLAHOMA



Nearly 200,000 students enrolled annually



Over 38,000 degrees and certificates awarded at all levels in the last academic year, and an increase of more than 6% over the last decade



Associate and bachelor's degree holders earn a median income 25% and 75% higher, respectively, than those with only a high school diploma.



Data from the National Center for Education Statistics show the cost of attendance at Oklahoma universities is among the lowest in the nation.



Over the last decade, STEM degrees increased 22% at all levels.



Our students learn here, earn here — over 93% of Oklahomans who graduate from a state system college or university remain and work in the state one year after graduation.



Only 28.5% of Oklahoma citizens hold a bachelor's degree or higher. The national average is nearly 36%, and of our surrounding states — including Arkansas, New Mexico, Missouri, Texas, Kansas and Colorado — only Arkansas has a lower percentage of citizens with a bachelor's degree or higher.



Of Oklahoma's 100 critical occupations, the **top 22** highest-paying jobs require an associate degree or higher, and eight of the **top 10** fastest-growing jobs require a college degree.

BY THE NUMBERS

Enrollment

During the 2023-24 academic year, 17,315 students enrolled at institutions in or adjacent to District 8.

Graduation

During the 2023-24 academic year, 3,475 students graduated from institutions in or adjacent to District 8.

Oklahoma's Promise

- In District 8, 354 students from the 2024 high school graduating class qualified for the Oklahoma's Promise scholarship.
- Currently, 882 high school students in District 8 are enrolled in Oklahoma's Promise.
- ➤ Since inception in 1992, 7,331 high school students from District 8 have received the Oklahoma's Promise scholarship.
- During the 2023-24 academic year, over 1,300 students at public higher education institutions in or adjacent to District 8 received approximately \$6.2 million in scholarships from Oklahoma's Promise.

Concurrent Enrollment

During the 2023-24 academic year, 2,058 students enrolled in 19,399 credit hours through concurrent courses at institutions in or adjacent to District 8.
