HIGHER EDUCATION IN OKLAHOMA



Over 200,000 students
enrolled annually



Over 41,000 degrees and
certificates awarded at all
levels in the last academic
year, and an increase of **more
than 15%** over the last decade



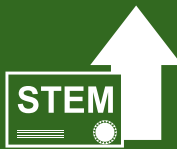
For every \$1 of state appropriations invested, the state system of higher
education **yields \$17.48 in economic output.**



Associate and bachelor's degree holders **earn a median income 25% and
75% higher**, respectively, than those with only a high school diploma.



Data from the National Center for Education Statistics show the **cost of
attendance** at Oklahoma universities is **among the lowest in the nation.**



Over the last decade, STEM degrees **increased nearly 29%** at all levels.



Our students learn here, earn here — **91%** of Oklahomans who graduate
from a state system college or university remain and work in the state one
year after graduation.



Of Oklahoma's 100 critical occupations, the **top 22** highest-paying jobs
require an associate degree or higher, and **eight of the top 10** fastest-
growing jobs require a college degree.

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BY THE NUMBERS

Enrollment

- ▶ During the 2024-25 academic year, 10,946 students enrolled at institutions in or adjacent to District 14.

Graduation

- ▶ During the 2024-25 academic year, 2,128 students graduated from institutions in or adjacent to District 14.

Oklahoma's Promise

- ▶ In District 14, 366 students from the 2025 high school graduating class qualified for the Oklahoma's Promise scholarship.
- ▶ Currently, 581 high school students in District 14 are enrolled in Oklahoma's Promise.
- ▶ Since inception in 1992, 5,050 high school students from District 14 have received the Oklahoma's Promise scholarship.
- ▶ During the 2024-25 academic year, over 800 students at public higher education institutions in or adjacent to District 14 received approximately \$4.6 million in scholarships from Oklahoma's Promise.

Concurrent Enrollment

- ▶ During the 2024-25 academic year, 783 students enrolled in 8,609 credit hours through concurrent courses at institutions in or adjacent to District 14.
